Cost

\$150.00 per girl and \$75.00 per adult will include 5 meals, camp shirts, all supplies and a patch.

Check in

We encourage all Troop members to travel and arrive at the same time.

Everyone will unload your equipment and it will be taken to their assigned campsite.

For safety, all cars must remain in the parking lot until check-out

Wednesday morning.

Trading Post

The trading post will be open at select times to purchase, ice, rope, etc.

A canteen will have light snacks, drinks, ice cream, so bring some \$.

Medical and Medications

Make sure the Medical Officer is aware of any special needs (physical challenges, diabetes, food allergies, etc). Simple first aid and medical concerns may be treated in the air conditioned health lodge on a 24 hour basis. Major medical concerns will be handled by transportation to the emergency room at the local hospital. Each Troop is responsible for distribution of medications for the girls. All prescription medication should be in its original pharmacy container, properly identified. Self-administered medications (asthma inhalers, OTC, allergy pills, etc.) are permitted to be administered by the girl with supervision of an adult.
