These scholarships are not available to students attending any of the U.S. military academies, because at these academies expenses covered by NESAs scholarships are already paid by the United States government.

## NESA MEMBERSHIP

Only those who have been granted the Eagle Scout Award by the Boy Scouts of America may hold membership in the National Eagle Scout Association.

## Glenn A. and Melinda W. Adams National Eagle Scout Service Project of the Year Award

---

In 2009, the National Eagle Scout Association established the Glenn A. and Melinda W. Adams National Eagle Scout Service Project of the Year Award to recognize valuable service of an exceptional nature by a Scout to a religious institution, a school, community, or other entity. The award recognizes the Scout for his Eagle Scout leadership service project, which is part of the requirements for earning the Eagle Scout Award. Each year, local councils select a council-level winner, and from that pool, each region selects a region-level winner. A national winner is then selected from the four regional finalists.

### Overview

To recognize valuable service of an exceptional nature by a Scout to a religious institution, a school, a community, or another entity while doing his Eagle Scout service project.

### Who Can Earn This Award?

Presented to select Eagle Scouts based on their Eagle Scout service project for 2017.

### How to Get the Award

An Eagle Scout, his parents, or any registered BSA volunteer (with the Eagle Scout's permission) may submit his Eagle Scout service project for consideration by completing a nomination form provided by CNCC NESA. Must be received by January 3, 2018.

## NESA What Are the Costs?

---

### Life membership

The life membership is available for a one-time payment of \$250. Members will receive attractive full-color pocket and wall certificates and a gold NESA pin.

### Special Membership

A ten-year membership is available for \$25. This membership is **only** available for Eagle Scouts who apply for a NESA membership **within** six months of their board of review date. Pocket and wall certificates, plus a silver NESA pin, are provided in this fee.

### Regular membership

A five-year new or renewal membership is available for \$35. Pocket and wall certificates, plus a silver NESA pin, are provided in this fee.

### Payment methods

The National Eagle Scout Association accepts credit cards, money orders, or checks for membership payment.

### Gift memberships

A gift of membership in the National Eagle Scout Association is an important, meaningful, and appreciated recognition of significant achievement. The importance of enrolling new Eagle Scouts cannot be overemphasized. NESA is the only way for the Boy Scouts of America to maintain contact with Eagle Scouts.
