# Webelos Woods

## Information and Rules

1. Check in will begin Friday afternoon at 3:30pm at the **Log Cabin**.
2. Dens will begin events promptly on Saturday at 9:00am after the opening ceremony.
3. Packs/dens will be responsible for providing all tents, equipment, food and drink.
4. Since the Central NC Council group policy covers all registered scouts and scouters, no additional insurance fees or proof of insurance is necessary. However, during registration, all non-registered campers will be asked to sign a liability wavier.
5. The Cub Scout Promise, Cub Scout Law of the Pack, Boy Scout Oath, and Boy Scout Law will be followed at all times. Violation of the rules or conduct unbecoming of a Cub/Webelos Scout may lead to expulsion from the camp.
6. The BSA 2-deep adult leadership policy will be strictly enforced at all times. Webelos must be supervised even during "pick-up" games of tag, soccer, football, Frisbee, or similar activities.
7. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed on camp property or at BSA events. Possession of them will result in dismissal from camp.
8. Illegal drugs found at the encampment, or suspicion of possession of illegal drugs will not only result in dismissal from the property, but will force the staff to notify law enforcement officials immediately.
9. In accordance with BSA policy, liquid fuels may be used for cooking and lighting only if the fuels are used under adult supervision.
10. ***If a burning ban is not in effect***, campfires are permitted in campsite. Dug fire pits are allowed if no trace remains upon checkout. It is recommended that fires be built in a container such as a charcoal grill to insure the campsite can be cleaned properly. Fires must be attended at all times. Fires must be cold before checking out Sunday morning.
11. Campsite should follow low-impact camping guidelines and should meet the campsite checklist guidelines (see enclosure) as closely as possible.
12. Sheath knives or knives with fixed blades are not permitted.
13. Defacing of any camp property, including live trees, may result in immediate dismissal from the camp with repair cost settled before dismissal.
14. Radios, TVs, electronic games, or other electric devices are not permitted
15. Fireworks of any type are strictly prohibited.
16. No bicycles will be permitted.
17. Quiet times should be observed with everyone in their campsites.

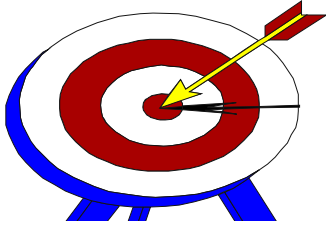

# Webelos Wood Events



**Archery Contest** - Each Scout will shoot 5 shots with a standard 20-lb. fiberglass bow at a distance of 15 yards. Dens meeting the scoring standard will be awarded up to 4 beads maximum

**BB Air Rifles** – After a safety instruction, each member of the den will be allowed to shoot 5 BB's. A feather will be awarded to each participating den. Beads, up to 3 maximum, will be awarded based on participation, score, and maintaining proper discipline.

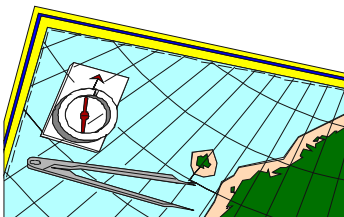
**Fire Building** - Each den will be given 15 minutes instruction on fire building. The patrol will then be allowed to collect materials and assemble its fire lay. On signal the patrols will start their fires using a Boy Scout hot spark kit. Beads, up to a maximum of four, will be awarded on the speed and height of fire.



**Wilderness Survival** – Dens will be instructed on simple wilderness survival techniques like shelter building, orientation without a compass, etc. Each den will have the opportunity to construct a natural shelter. Up to four beads will be awarded based on the thoughtfulness and resourcefulness used to construct the shelter.

**Pioneering Skills** – Each den will learn simple lashings to be used for building useful camp items. Dens will then be asked to construct a simple item with materials provided. The den will be awarded a feather and beads, up to a maximum of four, and will be awarded based on the number of scouts in each patrol tying the knots successfully.

## **Non-Scheduled Event**



**Map and Compass** - Each den will proceed from event to event using a map, directions, and a compass. In addition a number of **geocaches** will be hidden around camp. Each den finding a cache will contain a plastic bear paw that can be put on the den flag along with the beads.

## Leader's Hints

Remember that all packs are to use their own equipment for sleeping and cooking. For packs that don't have tents, a limited number may be available. To make your week-end more enjoyable and to begin teaching the Webelos more about being Boy Scouts, you may want to consider doing the following:

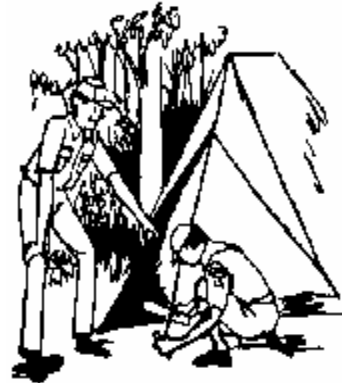
1. Make the Webelos Den like a Boy Scout patrol
  - a. Vote on a patrol leader for this trip.
  - b. Vote on a patrol name and obtain a patrol patch for their uniforms.
  - c. Make a patrol flag to attach the beads to.
2. Involve the scouts in making plans for the camping trip
  - a. Have some boys develop a duty roster.
  - b. Have some boys develop an equipment list and check out equipment.
  - c. Have some boys develop the menu and supplies list. For example:
    - Sat. Breakfast - Orange juice, cereal, pancakes, bacon
    - Sat. Lunch - Sandwiches, chips, and drinks
    - Sat. Supper - Hobo meals, Cherry cobbler, Kool-Aid
    - Sun. Breakfast - Apple juice, cereal bars, donuts
3. Train and make sure the Webelos scouts are prepared for the events
  - Archery** - Pick best archers to go first and encourage others
  - BB air rifles** - Pick best marksmen to go first.
  - Fire Building** - Obtain good tender to take with you (maybe cotton fluff etc.).
    - Practice obtaining a good spark.
    - Practice fire lays and best way to build big tall, fast, fires.
  - Wilderness Survival** – Outdoorsman badge prior to coming to camp
  - Pioneering** – Practice tying knots in den meetings
  - Map and Compass** - Train how to read map and use a compass.
    - Select a point scout.
4. Review requirements for **Outdoorsman Activity Badge**.
5. Prepare skit, song, or yell for Saturday night campfire.
6. Submit registration before February 19<sup>th</sup> so the staff will have enough materials and each member of your group can get a patch.
7. Insure each scout knows what personal equipment to bring.
8. Insure each scout knows details about the trip, when to leave, etc.

# **CAMPSITE CHECKLIST**

## **1. PACK AND DEN CAMPSITE LAYOUT**

Showing consideration of wind, terrain, safety, site assignment, and other relevant factors:

- a. Tents arranged by den
- b. Location of food storage, preparation, and cooking areas
- c. Location and storage of fuels
- d. Location of chopping area
- e. Pack/den identification - Flags, gateways, etc.
- f. Posted in campsite
  - 1) Menu for all den meals
  - 2) Duty roster for each den member
  - 3) Schedule of events/den itinerary



## **2. DEN COOKING AND CLEANUP**

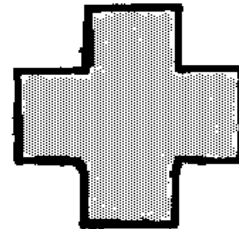
- a. Food storage(ice chests, food chests, patrol boxes)
- b. Potable(drinking) water storage
- c. Storage of pots, pans and utensils
- d. Cleanliness of den cooking, eating, cleanup equipment
- e. Den site clean and free of food scraps and trash
- f. Trash bags for disposal of trash and garbage

## **3. DEN FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT**

- a. 2 fire buckets with water in cooking area
- b. 1 fire bucket with water at each tent

## **4. PACK AND DEN FIRST AID METHODS**

- a. First aid kit in plain view and accessible
- b. Appropriate sized first aid kit
- c. First aid kit properly stocked with correct items



## **5. DEN CHOPPING AREA**

- a. Roped off
- b. Free of brush, trash and overhanging limbs
- c. Chopping block properly stationed and securely staked
- d. Tools properly displayed or stored
- e. Wood pile neat with some wood in waterproof storage

## **6. PACK AND DEN CONSERVATION**

- a. No hacked or cuts on live trees
- b. No pathways or leaves brushed away from camping areas
- c. No trenching of tents or other areas
