Camp Barnhardt-Shooting Sports Program Area Receives Funding

We are excited to announce that with the help of the National Rifle Association Foundation, Camp Barnhardt has been able to purchase and maintain its shooting sports equipment. Central N.C. Council was fortunate to receive a grant of \$500 dollars in 2006 and a grant of \$1,800 dollars in 2008 from this noteworthy organization. These monies have allowed the council to provide great bows, rifles and shotguns for the enjoyment of our scouts and leaders. In addition we have been able to purchase a gun safe and various cleaning supplies. This financial support has been instrumental in the teaching of shooting sports skills and safety for more than 3,000 scouts in the past 4 summers. In addition Camp Barnhardt has been the location of the Hunters Safety Tournament put on by the North Carolina Wildlife Department for the past 3 years. Each year this event has 34 teams from area schools and 340 students compete to be recognized for their outdoor sportsmen's skills. Thank you NRA for your assistance with educating youth in the proper use and safety skills with shooting sports equipment. Together we can educate responsible outdoorsmen for the future!
